WHEN TO ENROLL YOUR CHILD:

We have programs for pre-K through 12th grade learners. All 3rd grade students should enroll in Aleph (1st year) Hebrew and 3rd Grade Religious School

GAN BETH AM (3-5 year olds):

Gan Beth Am offers our preschool students the opportunity to feel at home at Beth Am. This weekly class is filled with learning through art, songs, and stories.

7TH GRADE PROGRAM:

7th grade students meet once per week for a combined class of Religious School and Hebrew School. This combined Hebrew and Religious School classes meet on Wednesdays from 4:30 – 6:00pm.

HEBREW SCHOOL SESSION PREFERENCE:

Session Preference for Hebrew School is given on a first come, first served basis. For the best chance of receiving your session preference, register early. While we will make every effort to give you your first choice we reserve the right to put your child in your second choice due to class size. Spaces cannot be held or guaranteed. Registration is date stamped and processed for all members in good standing. All others will be processed once the account is current. Please call the CBA Treasurer if there are questions about an account or if special financial consideration is needed. Your deposit (per child) must be included with registration material.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL DURING B'NAI MITZVAH YEAR

All students must be enrolled in Religious School and attend classes regularly at the time of their Bar or Bat Mitzvah, whether the date of their Bar or Bat Mitzvah occurs in their seventh, eighth or ninth grade year. All students are expected to complete the full school year, September – May, for which they enroll.

SECURITY ASSESSMENT FOR RELIGIOUS SCHOOL 2025-2026

We take safety seriously. The safety of your children is central to our mission. Security is constantly evolving and improving. To help offset the cost, each school family is assessed \$95 in addition to school tuition. The security that is being put in place will be in alignment with both Congregation Beth Am's and our school location's policies. While, security measures might look different at different locations, your child/children's safety is one of our highest priorities.

OPENING SESSION:

- Religious School begins on Sunday, September 7th, 2025.
- Hebrew School classes begin on Tuesday, September 9th or Wednesday, September 10th, 2025.

HEBREW RESOURCE ROOM:

On Wednesdays, we offer yearlong Hebrew classes for students who will succeed better in a small group learning environment. This class option is perfect for those with learning challenges or difficulties. If you would like to enroll your child in this program and he/she has not previously been enrolled in the Hebrew Resource Room, please call the Rabbi Educator. A minimum of 4 enrolled students is required to make a Hebrew Resource Room Class.

9th – 12th GRADE PROGRAM in partnership with American Jewish University

Our 9th – 12th graders can join in a new partnership with American Jewish University which allows our community to provide opportunities for CBA 9th-12th graders to take classes with Congregation Beth Judea & Or Shalom 9th - 12th graders which will earn them college credit. These classes will be taught by the educators of the three synagogues, will each be worth 3 general education credits, which students can apply to their intended college or university
